Halloween recipe

Halloween mummy² dogs

INGREDIENTS:

- filo pastry³
- hot dogs
- mayo
- pepper seeds



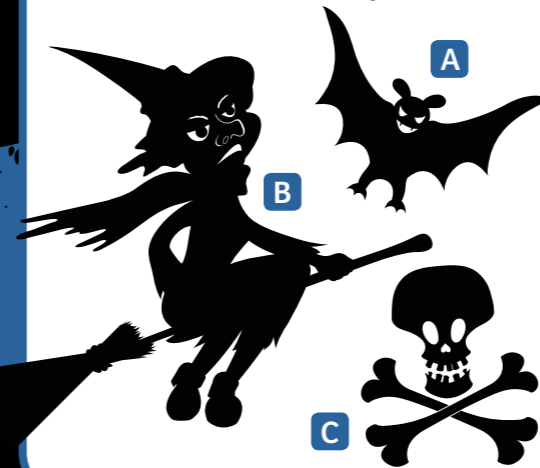
Make long strips⁴ of filo pastry. Wrap⁵ them around hot dogs so that they look like mummies. Leave space for the face. Bake at 190 degrees Celsius for 12-15 minutes. In the end, make two mayonnaise and pepper eyes.

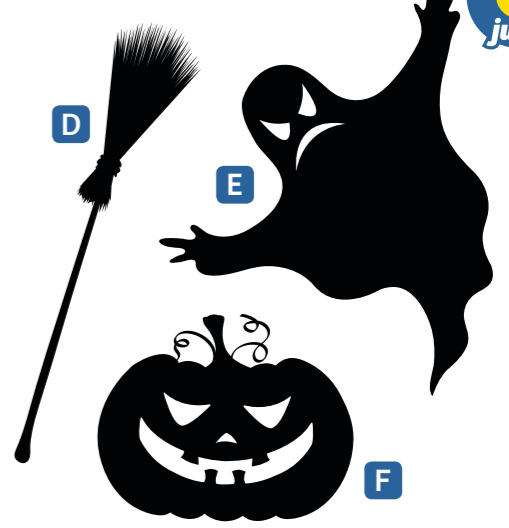
